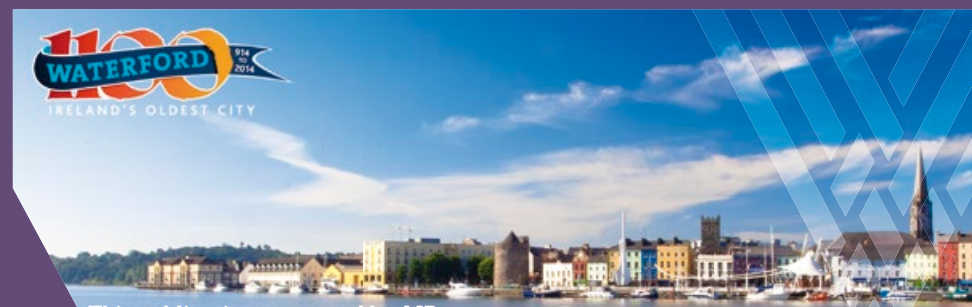

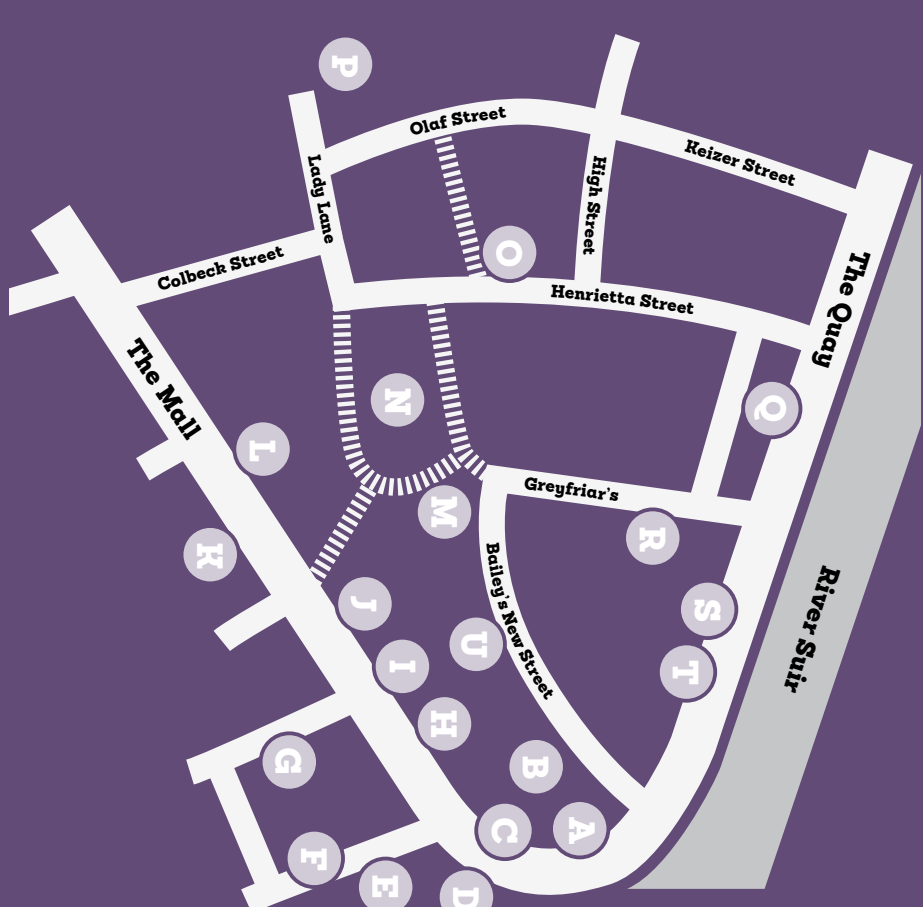

It begins here...

Did You Know...

Each year the 'Crucible' or 'Pot' in the Irish Handmade Glass furnace in Kite Design Studios, needs to be replaced. The constant heat and changes of temperature in the 2000 F - 2350 F range, as well as the corrosive nature of the raw materials as it melts, cause deterioration of the pot. If it was not replaced regularly, eventually it would crack and fail and the molten glass would seep into the furnace base. The crucible is made of engineered ceramic material and although it has a high thermal shock rate it needs to be heated very slowly to its operating temperature.

They then switch the furnace off and leave it cool slowly for a week. Again this is to ensure that the furnace itself doesn't crack by cooling too quickly.

On 2nd January 2014 the team in Irish Handmade Glass began the maintenance and replacement of the pot. The image shows the furnace with the front opened and the new pot in place. When all the maintenance and rebuilding has been completed the process of reheating the furnace begins. This is carefully completed over 72 hours and entails all of the team at Irish Handmade Glass practically living in the studio as the furnace progress needs to be monitored and adjustments made on an hourly basis. Finally the furnace was switched back on at 9 am, Wednesday 8th January and the process completed on Saturday 11th at 9am. The final step is the glazing of the crucible by melting 'cullet' (waste crystal from the blowing process) ready for the creation of wonderful hand-blown glass.

On 24th December last, Irish Handmade Glass began the process of cooling the furnace. Firstly they drained any excess spillage from the base of the furnace. The furnace was then heated to 2350 F in order to allow the excess crystal to become so hot that it flows out of the drain at the base of the furnace.
